Asking About Low Blood Sugars

- Moderate: Difficulty moving, confusion, or unusual behavior
- Severe: Seizures, coma, loss of consciousness, and combative behavior

- New VA mobile phone text system for medication refills.
 - They will now advise when your refills low and ask if you want a refill. Y or N. You can opt out of text notifications. Controlled medications will require special approval.
- There is a new initiative for Women's Health that focuses on Whole Health Coaching, fertility services, maternity, menopause and others.
- Blue Water Navy Vietnam Definition veterans who served within 12 nautical miles off the coast of Vietnam or Korea are presumed to have been exposed.
